Aboriginal Education:


Naomi Legg (Aboriginal Academic Success teacher / Librarian) is a wealth of knowledge and experienced educator. Our goal this year is to offer Teepee teachings in each of our school assemblies and in making this learning visible – a living force. A schedule to have Naomi come into each class as well as offer one-on-one student support has been crafted, and now we are working through an equity lens. At our last staff meeting, I shared the article by Verna J. Kirkness and Ray Barnhardt regarding the Four R's of Indigenous education, being respect, relevance, reciprocity, and responsibility. In this we will circle back to next month's meeting to envision a child's journey through education, K-12 and beyond venture.

Learning (Students and Staff):

Student learning at Wildflower feels like a seamless process due to the deep connection, attachment focus, and depth of knowledge that each educator shares with each child. Learning in each class has depth, is challenging, and fun (although sometimes 'teacher fun').

The staff gathers each Friday (and beyond) to extend learning and to talk about how to propel learning forward, request support from one another, and the team at large. Further when forwarded to our school-based team, we as a small group collaboratively address the needs of the child and create a plan to support the student and teacher along this learning journey - together.

For my own professional development, I am attending the Compassionate Systems' Leadership course work (multi-districts attending), at UBC Nelson, this Friday and Saturday (October 21st and 22nd). As well, I've just started reading the book 'Good Inside' by Dr. Becky Kennedy this morning. The plan is in mid-November, some staff and parents are going to be reading this as a novel study. I'm trying to get ahead of the game!





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Field trips / Volunteers:

Our teachers and staff are incredible at collaborating and value outdoor / experiential learning. This is a several step process, so a huge thank you to our educators for doing what is best for kids and following the safety protocols outlined. We are so thankful to each of you.




Lock down drill:
