



Hello families,



New year, new gear:




In Heather's class math seamlessly connects to year theme. Opportunities for all to shine, build leadership, and moments of ah ha.

Wildflower students are getting ready for February's Lantern festival.






Through the ages:

Embodying learning: Mummified oranges to ancient scripts / hats






Gameboard creations:
