Principal PAC report: January

Gr. 9 Transitions:

If your child is planning on attending LVR, there is a parent session for current grade 9 students to welcome and inform on Tuesday, February 7th from 6-7 p.m. Further, on February 13th, I will be taking Wildflower's grade 9's to LVR in the afternoon to complete their course sections on MyEd (finalizing course input from the students themselves). If your child is planning on attending either Mt. Sentinel (MSS) or Salmo Secondary (SSS), please contact me at the school and I will connect with Principal Maloff (MSS) or Principal Francis (SSS) to organize an orientation into one of our other feeder schools.

Recycling:

Into the new year, we have continued to recycle our paper and cardboard, as well as continue our compost initiative and pen recycling. As parents, we'd you're your support to remind all to reduce, reuse, and recycle. The least amount of waste we can accrue as a school community the better. Each class has their own system, but as a school community we will be expanding this to a larger system. Stay tuned for our progress next month.

Class configurations:

Currently, we are in process and working on class configurations for our four feeder classes entering our middle school program, as well as a larger school intake process. We have held two evening sessions with our upcoming Seedling parents as well as those hoping to enter our multi-age elementary program. With all these moving parts, my role as well as Cole (case manager / inclusive support teacher) is to work to ensure class composition meets the needs of the members of the British Columbia Teachers Federation (BCTF). This is to support the language bargained for by teachers to support the learning environments for all learners and teachers working conditions. In the next few weeks, we will work with teachers to complete this process. Your patience and understanding are appreciated.

Inside shoes and socks (need):

Friendly reminder to please check with your child to ensure that they have inside shoes and socks. Currently, there are quite a few that do not. This is important for these several reasons: one being for the upcoming fire drills (no time to run to find shoes), secondly, sanitary reasons (multiple people on flooring with bare feet – germ fest), thirdly, in case of broken glass/window, and fourthly, something falling on foot not in a shoe.
